BEST BAR Happy Ending

The arousing moniker—insider lingo for getting more than your back serviced by a masseuserefers to Happy Ending's previous incarnation as an Asian massage parlor. Now that the bi-level space has been reborn as a sleek lounge (and given a thorough Clorox treatment), the fun is strictly of the good, clean variety. But patrons know there's still plenty to get off on. The new owners took advantage of the old brothel's configuration, turning white-tiled sauna rooms into private hideaways and sticking plush spherical banquettes where hot tubs once lived. Both provide relaxing spots for slurping flirty cocktails like the Golden Screw and the Cantonese Mule. Chef Chris Santos's mature bar food, including barbecued-duck-confit empanadas and club sandwiches involving fois gras, make exquisite sponges for the potent juices. A hot-towel treatment is the foreplay to it all: A kindly server delivers, with tongs, a piping-hot washcloth with which to ready yourself.

HAPPY ENDING

If this downtown hipster lounge sounds like old news to you, that's because its clever location (in a two-story space that formely housed an Asian massage parlor) and name (same as the former occupant) made a big splash when it opened in January. Owned by the downtown good-cheer cartel responsible for Double Happiness and Wyanoka, Happy Ending also recently won TONY's Eat Out Award for Best New Bar. The shiny red booths upstairs and seedy tile nooks below continue to draw a cool crowd, and DJs spin nightly. Parties include Monday's model-packed DMR (Droppin' Mad Records) and Tuesday's Sneaker Pimpin'. Bar snacks from Wyanoka genius Chris Santos are heaven in the form of crispy-snapper-and-arugula tacos with mango salsa, or a five-spice-duck club sandwich.—Valerie Stivers 302 Broome St between Forsyth and Eldridge Sts (212-334-9676). 


NEW YORK Even before the last girder was removed from Ground Zero, New York started moving forward. Ritz-Carlton returned to the city with not one but two hotels: a sleek high-rise at Battery Park (212/344-0800; doubles from \$325) and a grand one on Central Park South (212/308-9100; doubles from \$425). The Lower East Side, once best known for its bars-the current favorite is über-hip Happy Ending (302 Broome St.; 212/334-9676)—has established itself as the neighborhood for dining out thanks to the spinoffs of wildly popular 71 Clinton Fresh Foods-A.K.A. Café (49 Clinton St.; 212/979-6096; dinner for two \$30) and Alias (76 Clinton St.; 212/505-5011; dinner for two \$60)—as well as stylish Latin spot Suba, much loved by design mavens for its dining room surrounded by water (109 Ludlow St.; 212/982-5714; dinner

Voted TONY's Best New Bar, this place is firmly part of the cutting-edge cool that characterises the Canal Street area. It's the speciality of owners Peter Kane and Oliver Pihlar to work miracles on dodgy locations, and once again they've excelled to create a laid-back lounge that transcends its past as a massage parlour. The swish ground floor is the place to sample the ample cocktail list. Downstairs, the design is edgier, with a packed-out dancefloor lined with tiled booths converted from steam rooms. 

Situated on the encroaching border of the LES at Forsyth and Broome Sts., the reading series takes place in a bar known as the Happy Ending Bar that's marked as a healing center on its yellow awning. One of our favorite things to do is stand around and watch newcomers figure it out.

Inside, a surprisingly swank bar serves drinks while the readers do their thing. Each is obligated to sing or dance or perform in some way in addition to presenting their material. The crowds are always thick, the guests are consistently amazing, and the fact that Amanda ends every show by encouraging people to "get drunk, go home with somebody" leads to that actually happening.

Editorial Review

The Scene

This former massage parlor makes a swish addition to a swiftly gentrifying neighborhood. Lounge in banquettes on the ground floor, or descend to the DJ-ready basement--where the original steam rooms have been renovated as tiled booths. The vibe is hip and fresh and attracts many of the fashion-forward young things who patronize the avant-garde boutiques nearby. The name is a reference to the coy way in which the space's previous occupants used to offer clients a "happy ending" to their massage.

The Booze

One thing this otherwise excellent venue hasn't yet got right is the house cocktail list. The Cantonese Mule, with Ketel One, ginger beer and lime juice, is ruined by the addition of Chambord. The house mojito is cloying, although the "H.E. martini" -- made with Grey Goose and a drizzle of scotch whiskey--shows promise. Stick to the standards while they figure things out.


